PE

Our PE unit for Autumn 1 is Dance (Under the Sea) and fundamental movement skills.

Foundation Subjects:

We will:

- Learn about the differences between arable, dairy and livestock farming and describe how the different seasons affect life on a farm
- Learn what the four points of a compass are and use it to navigate around a map.
- Use different rolling techniques to manipulate clay when making pumpkin.
- Use glockenspiels to perform a music unit called 'Hands, Feet, Heart'
- Learn about who a Muslim is and what they believe

PSHE

Our PSHE unit is called 'Being me'. We will learn:

- How to identify my safe places
- How to be responsible
- The importance of rules, rewards and consequences in a classroom

Reading

Our class read is 'Pumpkin Soup'

We will learn to:

- Revise set 2 and 3 sounds
- Read the year two common exception words list and red words

- Predict what might happen next based on what has been read

Maths

We will learn to:

- Multiply using the 2, 5 and 10 times tables
- Count in 2s, 5s, 10s and 100s
