Creative homework certificates

<u>Bronze</u> - if you complete <u>1</u> piece of homework this half term. <u>Silver</u> - if you complete <u>2</u> pieces of homework this half term. <u>Gold</u> - if you complete <u>3</u> pieces of homework this half term.

Earn 1 <u>Children's University</u> credit for each creative piece completed. Must be handed in with a completed reflection sheet.

Menu of Creative Homework Challenges

- Find out how to look after your digestive system with some colon-cleansing foods (cider vinegar, flax seeds, avocado and spinach are good) and make a song or poster encouraging people to look after their guts!
- Try a new food or drink that you have never tasted before.
 What do you like or dislike about its taste and texture?
- Research and find out about abstract art, in particular the work of Sonia Delaunay.
- Research about the early settlers such as the Romans and the Anglo-Saxons. Find out what kind of things they looked for when trying to find a place to settle and what things they would have needed.

- Write a letter to the sorting hat- Which house would you like to be in and why?
- Write a diary entry as Harry after your first day at Hogwarts.

Reading

Maths

We will:

- use compact written subtraction to subtract pairs of 3-digit numbers
- solve simple money problems with decimals to two decimal places
- use mental multiplication and division strategies
- recognise and compare acute, right and obtuse angles and identify perpendicular and parallel lines
- understand how to divide 2-digit and 3-digit numbers by 1 digit and numbers which give a remainder.
