We are going to: continue to develop our phonic knowledge, spelling words using our set 1 and set 2 sounds, as well as our red/tricky words.

Use groups of letters or letter like shapes when writing and engaging in the writing 'hooks' around our key texts and continuous provision texts.

Understanding the World

We are going to: Investigate what seeds need to start growing and plant seeds, vegetables and flowering plants in pots and take care of them.

Name and describe some adult animals and their babies that live in our local area and further afield.

Communication and Language

We are going to: Observe a range of fruit and vegetables using their senses and support children to express their ideas, make comments and ask questions.

Offer explanations about why things happen such as how vegetable scraps can change and grow.

Physical Development

We are going to: take part in a weekly coach led P.E. sessions with a focus on Fundamental movement skills Gymnastics rocking and rolling

Learn to form and write letters correctly using pencils, paint, and gloop.

PSED

We are going to: Follow the 'Jigsaw' PSHE topic, " Healthy Me."

Know the importance of making healthy food choices.

Investigate how germs are shared and understand the need for personal hygiene.

Maths

We are going to: Find addition and subtraction facts to 5 and then 10 by putting different numbers of white and gold beans into a seed tray.

Find and record addition facts to 6 and then 10 using animals and how many legs they have.

To be able to subitise (recognise how many items without counting) to five.

Familiarise themselves with coins through role play in a class supermarket.

Use measuring tools in our play and experiences such as when making butter.

Expressive Art and Design

We are going to: Make 3D models of farm vehicles and paint them.

Learn to sing farm themed songs such as 'Old McDonald's farm'

Explore ways to make simple rhythms and sound effects using homemade seed shakers.

Explore, use and construct with a range of fruit and vegetables to make a face in the style of the artist, Arcimboldo.

Share our creations with others and talk about our ideas and discoveries when using a variety of media and materials such as when making observational collages of fruit.
